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# Highlights

#### **ENROLLMENT**

- Since 2016, our enrollment has doubled.
- We added pre-K for 4-year-olds and now serve students in pre-K through 12th grade.
- Historically combined grades (i.e. 1st/2nd, 3rd/4th) have changed to individual classes.
- We added a 3rd-5th grade choir.
- We are choosing to accept students who come with increasing academic needs.

Generally, very few students above 5th grade can pass our math or language entrance exam. So in order to maintain our historic high standards, we have changed. We provide a large amount of learning support outside of regular classroom teaching to help our students catch up.

#### **EXPANDING TO BLESS THE CITY**

- We moved the Jr. & Sr. High School to their own space in downtown Hazleton.
- We expanded the ICS Thrift Store, adding several hundred square feet of retail space.

## **BUILDING COMMUNITY TIES & SUPPORT**

H.S. students use the YWCA & Hazleton Library.
They visit local businesses for Friday lunch
outings and participate in Dual Enrollment
college classes downtown. Students will take
art and photography enrichment at the
Hazleton Art League in January. Youth who
learn how to engage with local officials and
business leaders in the city will become young
adults with the opportunity to influence and
invest in the future of Hazleton.

Over the past 5 months through the EITC / OSTC tax credit program [icshazleton.org/sponsors], grants, and individual partnerships, we have received commitments just under \$100k for student scholarships, learning support, and investment in operating costs to propel us forward in achieving our vision.
